

# KANOSKI WINS MEDAL

**Ex-Wannamoisett Caddy  
Paces Qualifiers With 146  
in R.I. Golf Tourney**

An unsung and unheralded product of the caddy ranks won medalist honors in the R.I. amateur golf championship at the Wannamoisett C. C. in Rumford yesterday.

Providing this dramatic and surprising twist to the blue ribbon event of Rhode Island golf was William Kanoski, who fired rounds of 71 and 75 for 146 on the course where he once caddied.

The 31-year-old, Phillipsdale resident, now representing the Triggs Club, finished two shots ahead of his nearest rival, big John Fleming of Metacommet, the former Georgetown football player.

Fleming, shooting rounds of 72-78, ruined his chances of leading the field of 68 by taking a nightmarish eight on the fourth hole of his afternoon round. He, in turn, finished one shot ahead of his stylish swinging clubmate, Al Faenza, who led at the end of the first round with a brilliant 70. Faenza's drives wandered and he was nine strokes higher in the afternoon.

**Koslowski Qualifies Easily**

Stan Koslowski, champion the past two years, qualified comfortably with a pair of 79s. The husky former All-American football player scrambled but that's his game. He was satisfied with his score, and preferring match play to medal, he isn't due to really let out until the start of the man-to-man skirmishes this morning.

Koslowski, aiming to become the second in history to win the title three years running, drew a dangerous first-round opponent in Charley Palmer, ex-GI from Potowomut, who is making his first bid for the title since 1941. This may be the match of the day.

The medal test, as usual, had its casualties, a few more this year than others. Tom Pilkington, state public links champion from Triggs, was the chief casualty. Tom, playing far below standard, missed out by one shot in the end with his pair of 81s. He appeared safely in until the 17th hole of his afternoon round. He took an eight on this lengthy hole, wandering from one side to another.

Charley Morrill, of Metacommet, runner-up two years ago also missed out with 81-85. And so did such other leading contenders as Frank Di-Grado of Metacommet, Joe Porter of Bayside and Al Dias of Triggs.

Highly regarded Bill Newman of Metacommet also had a close call after soaring to 68 in the afternoon. He was among the morning leaders with

his 73, but his game completely fell apart on his second sojourn. He made the grade in the four-way playoff for the last three positions along with two home club representatives, Guy Baer and Ed Urquhart.

Jim Lineberry of Wamunetonomy, one of the grand old guys of Rhode Island golf, was the sudden death playoff victim. He finally was eliminated at the third extra hole, where after hitting home with a brilliant tee shot, took three putts from 12 feet. Urquhart, firing an amazing cross-country wood shot, and Newman had made the grade, with par fours on the second.

The issue then narrowed to Baer and Lineberry. The 66-year-old Lineberry, playing in the championship a 20th time, made the better tee shot at the short third, but his short game failed him when it counted most. Baer, virtually hole high on the fringe on the left, easily got his par, and won out when Jim missed his second putt, a 3-footer.

Lineberry's failure to qualify was the day's saddest note. Contestants and gallery alike rooted for him to make it the day long. It appeared he would, too, after a decidedly shaky start. He went seven over par on the first six holes, but then was two under even fours for the next 13. He had a par-equaling 35 on the second nine for a morning 77, but he was nine shots higher in the afternoon.

**Rooks Drops Out**

The scorching heat also took its toll of another gallant competitor, Ralph Rooks of Wannamoisett, who won the title back in 1924. Rooks failed to turn in a morning card, and after sitting out the afternoon round, served as the playoff referee. The loss of Rooks and Lineberry deprived the championship of a cherished nostalgic touch. No one expected them to go on to the crown, but both have been in the scramble so long, it was sad to see them out of it.

The qualifying deadline of 161 was the same as last year.

Kanoski, who has been helped with his game by George Gordon, Wannamoisett professional and his assistant, Fred Bentley, played a steady game. He had but one bad spot in the morning, asix at the sixth where he drove into the woods. He still made the turn in 36, improved one shot coming home with the aid of birdies at the 10th and 17th.

He had 12 pars and six bogies in the afternoon. As it was, he reached the last two holes, needing two pars for a 73, but finished with two bogies instead. His foe this morning will be Hedden Miller, leading home club threat.

Fleming, except for the damaging eight, played probably the steadiest game he has showed in major competition. He was particularly steady fashioning his pair of 36s in the morning. Faenza appeared, record-

bound after playing the first 12 holes of his first round in six under even fours, going out in 33, but he took a six at the comparatively easy 13th. He sprayed his tee shot here, the first sign of the errant drives that were to plague him the afternoon long.
