





Bill Newman played his home course in one under par and won the state amateur golf championship yesterday at Metacomet.

Newman took the 46th playing of the tourney by defeating John Hopkins of Triggs, 7 and 6, in the 36-nole final. A gallery varying from 800 to 1000 persons followed the match.

Newman had the best of his several excellent rounds in the final—and he saved the very best of these for the first nine of the last round, on which he fired a three-underpar 34.

He started off winning the first two holes and, at the end of the morning 18, led 2 up. Then he blew the match sky-high by firing four birdies—three in succession—going out in the afternoon. That shooting gave him a lead of 6-up by the 24th hole and he coasted in from there.

Nawman made it 7 up by winning the 29th and he closed out by halving the 30th on a six-foot putt. It was his first crack at the title in five tries and he made full use of it.

Hopkins, a 30-year-old power hitter who failed to qualify last year in his first shot, stayed in the match to the end. He kept chipping away at the 31-year-old Newman's leads, but only once managed to even the count.

On that occasion, he did it with sthe best single shot of the five-day tournament. This was on the fourth hole, where he got an eagle three—and missed making it a double weagle by inches. This came off his bearing in the six iron out of a tough lie in the rough, that rolled onto the green in


