

# R.I. Amateur Golf Tourney Under Way at Agawam This Morning

## Strong Field Seeks Crown Faenza Holds

Qualifying for the state amateur golf championship will get under way at 7:30 this morning at Agawam Hunt and will continue until the last of the 99-man field completes 36 holes this evening.

The low 31 scorers, plus defending champion Al Faenza of Metacomb, will begin match play tomorrow morning. Two rounds are scheduled daily leading to the 36-hole final Sunday.

This year's tourney was shifted to the weekend to eliminate the necessity of the players' taking a full week off from work and also to permit more people to witness the closing rounds.

For the first time in the history of the tourney, the defending champion automatically qualifies for match play. Faenza was assigned the No. 2 position in the draw and the medalist of course, gets the No. 1 spot.

Faenza, who won the event last year at R.I. Country Club after several challenges, is prepared to make a strong defense. He has captured the championship field ever assembled for the championship.

The Metacomb golfer's top threat is Bob Kosten of Wampanoag, the former two-time winner whom Faenza defeated last year. They met in the semifinals and Al took a 3-and-2 break.

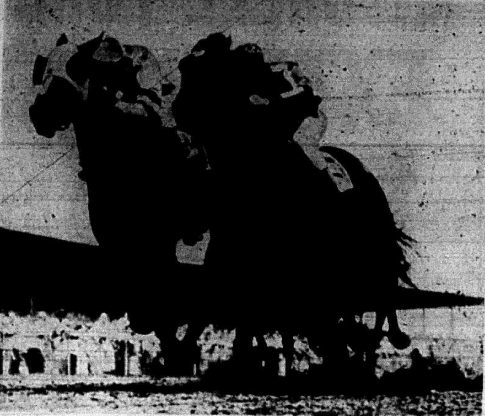

# Koslowski Wins Medal by One Stroke With 145 in State Amateur

## Deadline Falls At 155; Kosten Late Scratch

Stan Koslowski of Pawtucket, established as an amateur only last week, signaled his return to amateur competition yesterday by winning the medal in the qualifying round of the Rhode Island amateur golf championship at Agawam Hunt.

Playing consistently, Koslowski had rounds of 72 and 73 which gave him a 145 total and medal honors by one stroke over Angelo Santilli of Pawtucket and Joe Sprague of Wampanoag. Santilli and Sprague were headed for the low score after carding 69's in the morning but they faded slightly from that hot pace in the second round and needed 77's. Each had a chance on the 36th hole to catch Koslowski but missed length. Santilli missed from 12 feet, Sprague from 18 as they tried to match the big fellow from Pawtucket.

Koslowski's paring role was hardly surprising for he had won the championship in 1946 and 1947 and played for 14 years in the competition in 1948. This year Kos lost in the quarter-finals to Johnny Malighan of Trigg.

### Playoff Needed

Two years later he served as a professional for nine months but decided to return to the amateur ranks. The scoring yesterday, while over par, was better than a year ago at the Rhode Island club where the qualifying deadline fell at 165 whereas yesterday's limit was 155. Four players were involved in a tie for two places at that figure.

The tournament lost some of its luster when it was held early yesterday morning that Bob Kosten of Wampanoag, former Rhode Island and New England champion would not compete. Kosten generally regarded as the principal threat to the reign of the defending champion. At Pawtucket, Kosten, notified Ed Perry, secretary of the RIACA that business matters would prevent his playing.

Sperry's day in yesterday's Rhode Island medal play left asking the 31 qualifying places for medal play, which starts this morning. Panna did not play, having been awarded a place in medal play because of his victory last year. "Cap" Kania was a medal play at Rhode Island golf but one that met with general approval.

With Koslowski's Santilli Sprague showing the way, closely followed at 147 by Frank McElreath of RICC and young Larry Mowry of Wampanoag, the scores for the medal were particularly tight. However a preponderance of the qualifiers were bunched in the 152 and 153 brackets.

As a general thing, name players made the grade comfortably enough. All the former champions in the field—Fred Clark (145), Bill Newman of Wampanoag (152), Bobby Allen, Wampanoag (153) and Fred Cramer (154), the medalist, (154) made it. Tom Larson of RICC and John Hopkins, Pawtucket, considered likely qualifiers, missed, carding 158 and 156. Fred Newman, Wampanoag, was in the playoff for the last two places.

His rivals in that added skirmish were Audley Clarke of Agawam Hunt, Norm Lutz of Pawtucket and Frank Avolio of Wampanoag. Clarke and Newman won qualifying places in the playoff. Clarke at the first hole and Newman at the second. Avolio, however, did not participate in the playoff, having left the club before it was started.

John (Daff) Gammons, the 1924 titleholder, was honored as the oldest living former champion at a dinner last night at the Agawam Club. Ronald C. Green, RICA president, and Ralph Brooks, a past president, spoke briefly. Eddie Perry, RICA secretary, presented medals to the qualifiers.

New York (AP)—Willie Mays closed his 26th and 27th home runs as the New York Giants overcame a 3-0 deficit and defeated the Philadelphia Phillies 8-5 yesterday.

The Giants collected 10 hits against four hurlers, half of them for home runs. Buddy Mays' pair, giving him 10 in his last 10 games, Alvin Dark, Hank Thompson and rookie Gail Hestris also sent drives into the seats.

Three of the circuit clouts came in the sixth inning when the Giants scored six times and took a 6-5 lead. Up to then, Mays' Dickson, Philadelphia's veteran right-hander had allowed one hit, a third-inning homer by Bobby Hoffman.

Windy McCall, third of four Giants hurlers, was credited with the victory but it was Mays' Grooms who protected his decision with a superb three-inning relief effort.

Bob Negray was on the mound in the eighth when Mays smashed his second home run of the game and Harris rapped his sixth of the season, putting the game beyond reach. Mays was charged with the loss.

len of Wannamoisett, 2 and 1, in the morning round. Then he took on Metacomet's Fred Campanelli, another ex-champ, and caged him, 2-up.

But this was far from all the devastation the young group caused. Bobby Pacheco of Triggs, he's 22, eliminated ex-champ Brad Oxnard of Metacomet, 1 up. And Joe Sprague, 24, moved ahead impressively with a 5-and-4 second-round triumph over Ed Jennings of Valley.

Frank McBride, a member of the "middle" guard at 31, accounted for the other ex-winner in the field, Bill Newman of Wannamoisett. McBride, representing R. I. Country Club, won 1 up, but had to go to the 19th hole to do it.

## Gain Final Round in State Amateur Golf Play at Agawam Hunt

The state's new-golfing phenom, 18-year-old Larry Mowry of Wamumetonomy, and Angelo Santilli of Potowomut, shotmaker of established reputation, gained the final round of the state amateur golf championship with superb firing in the scorching heat yesterday at Agawam Hunt in East Providence.

They will clash for the state's most treasured golf crown over the 36-hole route today with the first round starting at 10 a. m. and the second at 2 p. m.

This is the first time in the 53-year-old championship that the final has been contested on Sunday and one of the largest galleries in years is expected to watch the duel between the prodigy and the experienced campaigner, who is making a ninth challenge for the title that has so persistently eluded him.

Young Mowry, who had eliminated two former champions in the first rounds on Friday, continued his amazing advance with victories over Tom Cunningham, state junior titlist from Triggs, and seasoned Fred Newman of Wannamoisett yesterday.

He beat Cunningham, a close friend, one up, in a tense and dramatic duel that wasn't decided until the final putt. He then followed this triumph with a smashing 7-and-5 victory over Newman. He closed with three amazing birdies against Newman, which left him three under par for the round and two under for the day.

The tall and thin Newporter, rated the best prospect uncovered in this state since the late Johnny Burke, amazed the spectators with his skill. He played as though dedicated, particularly in rolling home putts, short and long. Except for the late Danny Fairchild, who won the title at age of 17, and Burke, winner at 18, there's never been anything in this championship to match Mowry's remarkable advance.

Meanwhile, Santilli, playing with the precision of the master
